What is The Penguin Project? The Penguin Project is a musical theater production that casts children and young adults with disabilities in all roles. All will sing, dance and act in the show. Those individuals (Artists) will get assistance from on-stage peers (Mentors).

Young Artists with Disabilities

The Penguin Project is open to any individual age 10 to 22 with a disability. This includes (but is not limited to) Down Syndrome, cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities, visual impairment, hearing impairment and neurological disorders.

Peer Mentors

The Penguin Project utilizes a "peer mentor" system, linking each young artist with an age level peer who does not have a disability. The peer-mentors work side by side with their partners, assisting them throughout the entire rehearsal process and on stage.
